Oconee State Park, Mountain Rest, SC

Oconee State Park is a beautiful park located in Mountain Rest, SC, outside of Greenville, SC. The park offers

a variety of recreational activities such as fishing, canoeing, swimming and hiking. Oconee is located near several popular whitewater rafting centers and the vast Lake Hartwell. Oconee offers primitive camping and sites with electricity and running water. Camping prices are generally around \$12.00 per person, but group discounts are available.
